Beloved Ones,

I began a sermon I gave ten-years ago by quoting a church consultant who said, "85% of all churches are cruise ships that need to become battleships". The consultant, in trying to put parish-based ministry into crystal clear focus, used this analogy of the cruise ship and the battleship and challenged readers to assess their parish-based ministries. It's a good analogy for us Orthodox since we are use to understanding our churches as "ships". We even call part of the church "ship" or better known as the nave. With so many reminders that we are a "ship" we should probably ask ourselves often, what kind of ship are we. Are we a cruise ship? When we are on a cruise ship we don't do any work. Someone else does the work and takes care of every need and want. Every event, except for lifeboat training is optional. We can pick and choose what we want to do, kind of like a buffet. We have no responsibilities and no accountability. It's the cruise director's job and that's what we pay him to do.

Then there is the battleship. The battleship has a mission and in most cases, it is a life or death mission. Every person on board has a job to do; a job that must be done to the best of their ability. Everyone must work together for the success of the mission, and in some cases, mutual survival. Everyone has responsibilities and everyone is accountable.

Anyone who has spent time aboard a cruise ship and battleship knows that the way of life onboard the two vessels are polar opposites. Cruise ship passengers are relaxed, tan, and well-fed. Battleship sailors are sleep deprived, grungy, and edgy. No one is his right mind would vacation on a battleship. Then again, no one is his right mind would confuse a battleship for a cruise ship. There are few things as satisfying as being part of a focused, disciplined, hard-working team that knows its mission, understands and fulfills its responsibilities, is well-trained, and strives constantly to improve and expand. The contrary... not so satisfying.

It seems clear to me that God is calling us to be a battleship and that each of us has a divine calling to find and fill his or her particular niche in the ministries of our parish. God is calling us to find our place among the crew and to do our role to the best of our ability. God is calling us to responsibility and accountability on this spiritual life or death mission. God is calling us to unity of mind and heart, to being focused, disciplined and hard-working. By working together our ministries will improve and expand for the glory of God and for the benefit of our souls. Please consider this divine calling and get on board! *Father Jerry*

TREASURER'S REPORT

The operations fund balance as we enter October is \$12,629. The balance in the dedicated fund is \$9,594. This includes \$543, which was collected at the fundraising luncheon sponsored earlier in September by the Drakatos family. Thank you, Pete and Katharine. There was also \$832 collected the subsequent Sunday for International Orthodox Charities and their Hurricane Relief effort. There have also been some cash donations for the hurricane relief hygiene kits. Thank you to everyone who has stepped up in this time of need for so many and for our Theological School and its students.

Care Ministry

Meals: One of the major services the Care Ministry will provides is that of Meals - preparation and delivery. This is appropriate for families of ill parishioners or the parishioners their selves. In the cases of hospitalized parishioners, their families may need meal assistance. When the parishioner returns home it provides another opportunity to offer meals. Those recuperating are often in need of meals as well. A new mother finds meals to be a big help as she and the family adjusts to a new baby. A time of loss provides an additional opportunity to provide meals.

Who can make a referral for meals? Referrals can be made by Father Jerry, another parishioner, or family member.

How is a referral for meals made? Referral forms can be found on the information table in the nave and submitted there as well. Journal entries from a pilgrim on her journey to fullness...

~In the last three years I guess I've read nearly 200 books on Christianity and Jesus, but I don't seem to remember much of it in detail. Father Jerry said that "reading won't get you there". When he said this to me, I felt a kind of despair because "getting there" by reading and studying things is mainly how I have lived my life. When I left him that day, I couldn't imagine any other way of following my Christian path if I stopped reading about it. And yet, I decided to take his comment seriously and stopped reading.

~I practiced the morning and evening prayers and began to sit in contemplation in the early mornings, going over my journey so far. I realized that I felt deeply changed from my short time at St George's. It was as though the liturgy and the teachings about Jesus were a guiding light leading me. I would often get thoughts or insights during my day that felt new and a bit surprising to me as though my "inner radio" has been tuned to a new channel. Praying, contemplating, and saying the Jesus Prayer felt like nourishment and sustenance. Going to church-just walking in and smelling the incense-was an experience in the hoped for, but as yet unseen, God.

~I have a hunger and a thirst for God, to love and know Him more deeply. I have a hunger and thirst for the Eucharist, that Mystery, that reality of the Living God. I am being drawn toward it in a slow and incremental way and experiencing more and more that He is with me. I can no longer imagine living in the fallen world without the joy of the Church. It is so embracing and comforting, not just spiritually, but in the fellowship of like-minded souls, that I'm just beginning to know. I began reading about the real Jesus, the one behind the Gospels, the esoteric core of Christianity. In the beginning it was mere curiosity but after awhile I began to think, "Something or someone is calling; something or someone is responding to me". I felt called but didn't know who was calling.

~I still have moments when I observe the demands on my time and think, "This is annoying!" or, "These services are too long" or, "This path requires too many hours per week!", and I thought, what am I doing here? I'm starting to look past all these thoughts-they don't seem to promise anything except a dead-end stop, whereas following this inner voice takes me past the institutional stuff of the church. I want the hidden kernel that I know is there. The Divine Light which I have seen in rare moments.
