Peace on Earth: A Nativity Reflection by Metropolitan Nicholas+

At this special time of the Christian year we hear the story of the birth of Christ. St Luke's account of the Angel's announcement of this good news to the shepherds closes with these words: "And suddenly there was with the Angel a multitude of the heavenly hosts, praising God, and saying: 'Glory to God in the highest, and on earth, peace to men of good will". This "peace" was not dream of the angels. It was a real message from God to man. It was the embodiment of a divine and providential plan for human life. This plan was for charity and justice among all people. It was a solemn promise that God renewed when His Son appeared in our midst.

With the spectacle of warring nations before us in these present days, we are tempted to despair; yet the day of hope is on its way. On that day, even the greatest sinner will listen to St Paul's words, "For the rest, brethren, rejoice, be perfect, take exhortation, be of one mind, have peace, and the God of peace and of love will be with you" (II Corinthians 13:11). This peace among men was a gift of God. It was a gift that "surpassed all understanding". But like every gift, it could be subject to abuse. It could also be misunderstood, sold out, broken and betrayed. In fact, peace has been subjected to all these. Men and women who concealed their real will and befouled this peaceful gift from God. But peace was a promise and not a dream that God renewed when He sent His Son. We read this in the Acts of the Apostles, "God sent the word to the children of Israel preaching peace by Jesus Christ" (Acts 10:36). Only the sins of men could destroy this peace, and men have tried to ever since.

There is in every person a desire for peace in his own soul. There is a desire for peace with man and a desire for peace with God. To have it, we must listen and obey, and become hopeful and courageous. We must believe with the supreme faith of St Paul who said, "I can do all things in Him who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:13). It is in this strength of Christ that we find our peace. It is only in His principles of charity and justice that it can be bought, and then men of good will become men of God's will. Beginning with this Christmas Day, let us be men and women of goodwill. Men and women who cultivate peace in our hearts. Peace with God and peace with our fellow human beings. One such heart will make for peace in our home. Two such hearts will make for peace in our family. A thousand such hearts will restore hope. Millions of such hearts will make peace in our nation and in the world. Let us remember the words of the blessed Augustine to the early Christians: "This peace, the very name of which you so love and cherish, go after it, desire it, love it in your homes, in your wives, in your children, in your friends and in your enemies".

Wishing you the gift of peace this Christmas!

This Assembly, we will be electing members to the Parish Council to serve two year terms starting 2018, & approving the 2018 Budget. After input and discussion the Parish Assembly will held in the Fellowship Hall after a brief fellowship to improve the use of our time together. In November the Parish Council authorized the creation of a Safety Committee to review safety concerns of our Parish and it's facilities, along with reviewing and updating policies of the Parish concerning safety matters. As we continue to better organize our Parish and work towards our goals and aspirations in our shared service to God, it is truly all of us together in our St George family that make it possible with our faith in God.

As of November 30, the operations account has a balance of \$8,927. Please make every effort to fulfill your 2017 stewardship. The dedicated account has a balance of \$8,973. Over \$7,500 is specifically earmarked for the building fund and the construction of a consecrated place of worship. There also is \$100 restricted for use in our church school and \$166 for youth activities. The remaining \$1,180 is not restricted to any particular program or project and will be kept in reserve at this time for any unexpected maintenance.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ ~

"To recover the missionary dimension of the Church is today's greatest imperative. We have to recover a very basic truth: that the Church is essentially Mission, that the very roots of her life are in the commandment of Christ: 'Go Ye therefore and teach all nations.'" (Matthew 28:19) ~ Fr. Alexander Schmemann

As we journey through the Nativity Fast, we have been looking for ways to truly be a 'Mission Parish', in other words, a parish that embraces the Gospel message and proclaims it to the world. It is relatively easy to write an almsgiving check to those in need, but not so easy to live an authentic Gospel life. While researching Missions, I found a challenging article by Fr. George Tosi that outlines 10 things we can do to 'grow' a Missional mindset in our lives and in our parish. I will share the first item here: 1. Pray for Missions. Simply pray for them so that we can be united in one spirit. St. Innocent in his "Instructions to Missionaries" wrote, "The first and most efficient preparation is prayer, which alone can open the spring of highest teaching and bring down a blessing upon every good beginning and work." Pray for missions and missionaries so that they are never far from your or your parish's thoughts.

As such, pray that God will bring people to your own front door. Mission begins as soon as you step outside the Church but is found in fullness in the Church. The wonderful prayer for the Catechumens is, simply put, a prayer for mission. So earnestly pray that prayer at the Liturgy. As one OCA bishop put it, "If you don't have any Catechumens, go out and get some!" All great work begins and is sustained through prayer! Please pledge with me to fulfill this challenge for the parishes in Salem, Roseburg, and Eugene, as well as throughout our Metropolis.
